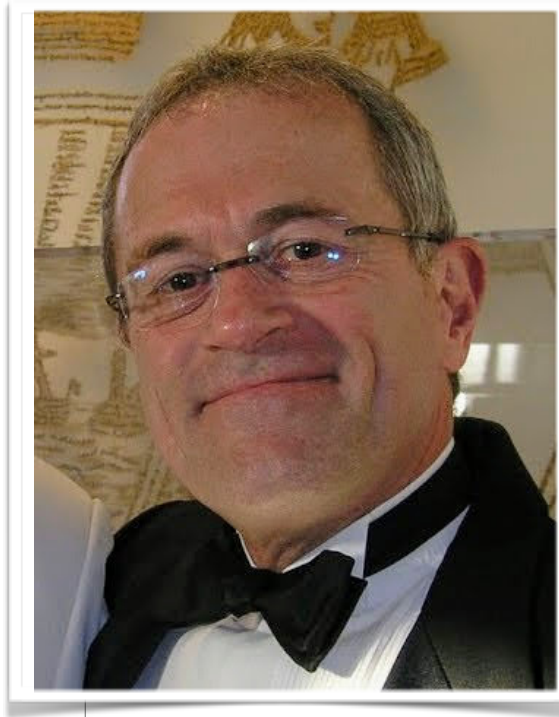

DAN E. RILEY, JD
